**PHIL 002: Contemporary Moral Issues.** Philosophical analysis of contemporary moral issues such as: abortion, discrimination, sexual morality, punishment, the obligation to obey the law, suicide, euthanasia, war, privacy.

**PHIL 161: Ethics.** A study of the major classical moral philosophers in the Western tradition and of some selected problems of metaethics.

**PHIL 168: Ethics & Families.** An analysis of some of the ethical issues that arise in and with regard to families of different kinds. Issues may include gender relations in “traditional marriages”; the ethics of same-sex marriage; the morality of abortion, surrogate mothering, and cloning; the justice of school vouchers; the grounds for universal health care; and possible gender inequalities in divorce.

Qualifications: Masters in Philosophy required, Ph.D preferred. Preference will be given to applicants having previous teaching experience at the university level.

Salary: Remuneration is \$4,909.95 per course
